

**The Austrian Ludwig Wittgenstein Society is pleased to announce the
Eleventh International Wittgenstein Symposium**

from August 4 (arrival) to August 13, 1986, in Kirchberg/Wechsel (Lower Austria, near Vienna). The theme of this year's symposium will be "RECENT DEVELOPMENTS IN EPISTEMOLOGY AND PHILOSOPHY OF SCIENCE". The following sections are planned:

1. Wittgenstein: His Contribution to Epistemology and Philosophy of Science
2. Language and Epistemology: Epistemological Standpoints
3. Philosophy of Mathematics
4. Methodological Problems of Scientific Disciplines
5. Theories of Scientific Progress

"DIGITAL INTELLIGENCE. FROM PHILOSOPHY TO TECHNOLOGY". A Symposium in honour of KURT GÖDEL (1906-1978) will be part of the programme of the conference.

Scholars wishing to present a paper on a topic which falls within the above themes (papers for sections 2-5 need not be connected with Wittgenstein's philosophy) should request an abstract style sheet from either the President of the Austrian Wittgenstein Society, Dr. Adolf Hübner, Markt 234, A-2880 Kirchberg am Wechsel/Austria, or Professor Werner Leinfellner, University of Nebraska, Department of Philosophy, Lincoln, NE 68588/USA. The deadline for receipt of abstracts is May 31, 1986. Should more papers be offered than can be accepted, selection will be by decision of the organizing committee. Contributors will be informed of the committee decision not later than July 15, 1986. Official languages will be English and German.

Those planning to attend the conference should contact Dr. Hübner at the above address for further information as soon as possible. Conference fees will be 1.200 Austrian Schillings for non-students and 400 Austrian Schillings for students.

Up to six graduate or undergraduate academic credits may be earned in conjunction with attendance at this conference – three for attending a prior three-week lecture series in London and/or for attending the conference.
